This game is part of a series developed to practice beginning reading skills. Adults, be sure to read through the directions and information before playing together. It will give you lots of tips to enhance learning!


Included in this file are all of the directions you will need to create this learning game. It is formatted to fit on a plastic pencil case like you might find at the dollar store, but an envelope works well too.

#### **Steps:**

- 1. Print out all pages single-sided.
- 2. Cut out all boxes on purple lines.
- 3. OPTIONAL: laminate items, affix labels to box
- 4. Cut the puzzles into pieces between each letter. Get creative with waves and zig zags!
- 5. Put directions, info page, and other materials into your box or envelope.
- 6. Have lots of fun!



# Long Vowel Teams



A vowel team is when two vowels work together to make one sound.

The vowel teams that we will be working with in this activity all make the long vowel sound.

A long vowel sound is pronounced the same as its letter name.

The letter o makes the long vowel sound, while the letter a is silent.

In most cases, the vowel sound that is pronounced as its name is the first vowel in the vowel team.

Such as in the word <u>team</u>: the "e" says the long sound, while we don't hear the "a".
